The 2025 Manx Grand Prix and between Sunday 17th and Monday 26th August, and the 2025 Classic TT will take place between Wednesday 20th and Friday 29th August.

Whilst, separate events there will be one Press Office function in operation across the Classic TT and Manx Grand Prix. Therefore, media personnel will only be required to submit one media accreditation application via the Isle of Man TT Races Accreditation Portal: press.iomttraces.com

The 2025 Manx Grand Prix and between Sunday 17th and Monday 26th August.,and the 2025 Classic TT will take place between Wednesday 20th and Friday 29th August.

The Manx Grand Prix is organised on a partnership basis between the Isle of Man Government Department for Enterprise and the Manx Motor Cycle Club as Race Promoter, and ACU Events Limited as Race Organiser, and the Classic TT is organised on a partnership basis between the Isle of Man Government Department for Enterprise as Race Promoter, and ACU Events Limited. Both the Manx Grand Prix and Classic TT (the events) are organised in accordance with the ACU National Sporting Code, the Road Racing Standing Regulations, and the Environmental Code. With both the events being held on the 37.73-mile TT Mountain Course in accordance with the Road Races Act 2016.

The Press Office for the Manx Grand Prix and Classic TT is operated by the Department for Enterprise Motorsport Team in the strategic interests of the Department for Enterprise, and acts under the authority of the Race Organiser.

MEDIA ACCREDITATION

Applications for media accreditation for the 2025 Classic TT and Manx Grand Prix must be submitted via the Isle of Man TT Races Accreditation Portal: press.iomttraces.com/register

Accreditation will close at 17:00 GMT on Monday 4th August, 2025.

Requests for accreditation can be made after this date by emailing the Press Office. Decisions on processing and evaluating late applications will be made on a case-by-case basis.

Media accreditation is issued on an individual basis. Organisations seeking accreditation for multiple personnel must submit an application for each individual seeking accreditation.

- Journalist
- Photographer
- Radio
- TV, Film & Videography
- Content Creator
- Public Relations



MEDIA ACCREDITATION

All applications must include an ID photograph to be used on your pass and a commissioning letter from either:

- The editor or publisher of a publication or news outlet, with a guarantee that the applicant's coverage will be published;
- A representative from an industry-relevant company or brand;
- The team manager of a Classic TT or Manx Grand Prix race team - if filming on behalf of a competitor please refer to Competitor Media Policy.

Individuals who have previously received media accreditation for the Isle of Man TT Races or Manx Grand Prix must provide a minimum of three examples of previously published work relating to the Manx Grand Prix for either:

- A paid-for print publication with at least 3 published editions;
- A free print publication with a minimum circulation of 200,000 copies;
- A digital outlet or social media brand with a minimum audience of 100,000.

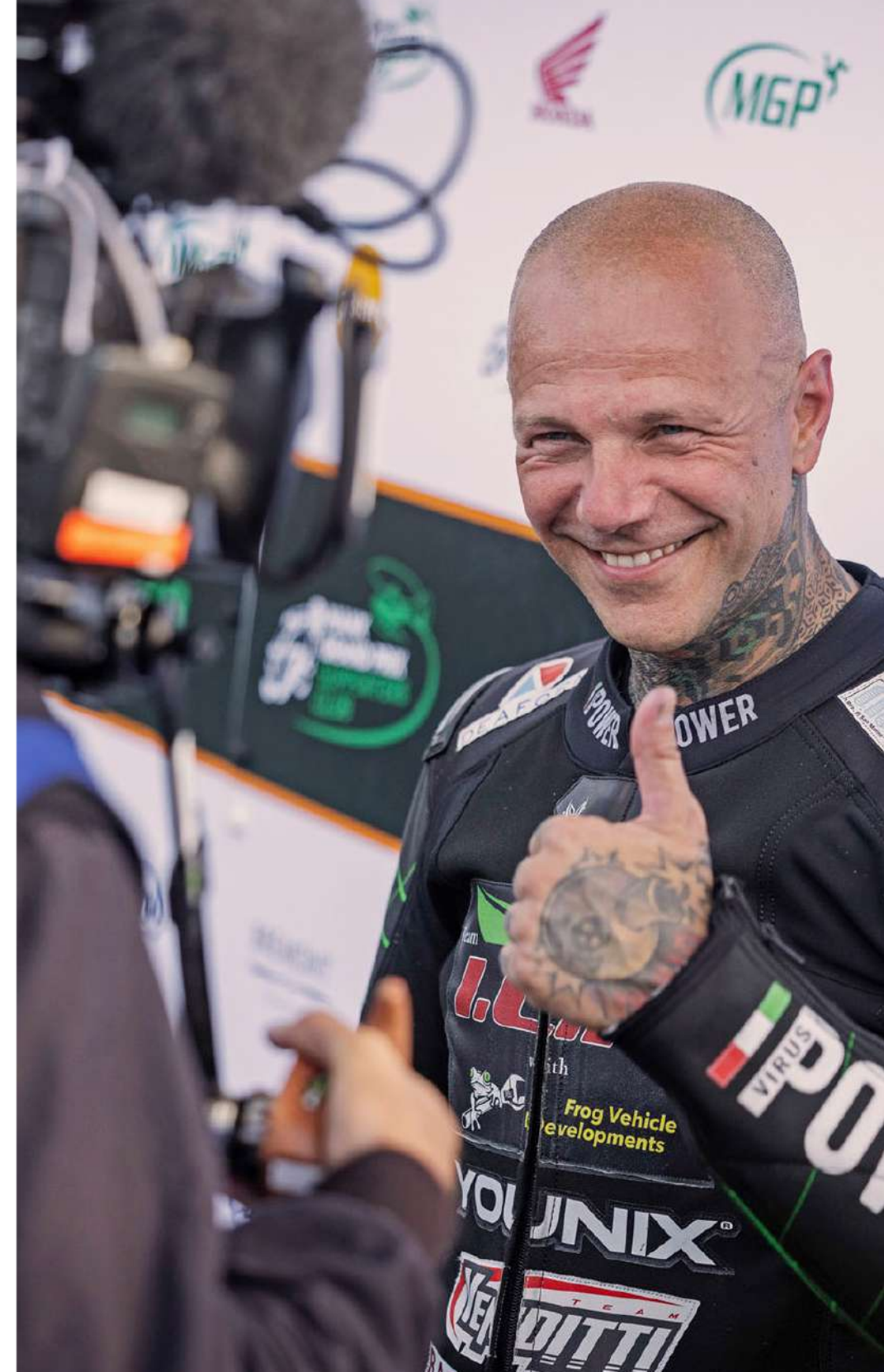
Individuals who have not previously received media accreditation for the Isle of Man TT Races or Manx Grand Prix must contact the Press Office prior to submitting their application to confirm details of their accreditation requirements and their commission, with applications evaluated on a case-by-case basis.

Some applications will be required to submit further documentation and complete additional steps dependent on the accreditation category - see Pass Types & Allocation.

The Press Office may request further information regarding your application and will endeavour to process all applications by 5th August 2025, however applications may still be reviewed in the week prior to the event.

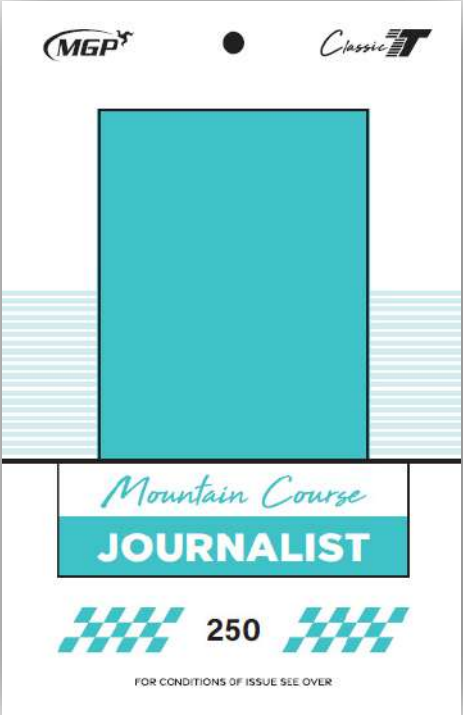
PLEASE NOTE: The Press Office reserves the right to refuse any accreditation application or withdraw any accreditation. Reasons for these actions include, but are not limited to, the following:

- If the Press Office believes the application is not in the strategic interests of the Classic TT or Manx Grand Prix;
- If the applicant has previously had a media pass withdrawn under the authority of the Race Organiser;
- If the applicant has been defamatory to the Race Organiser, either Race Promoter, or the Press Office.

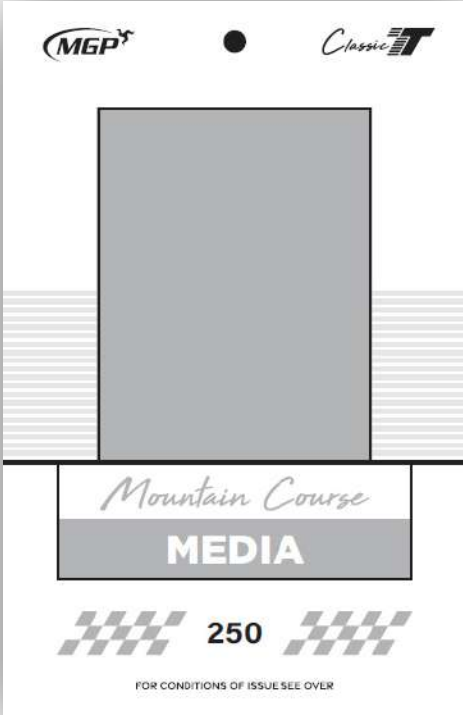

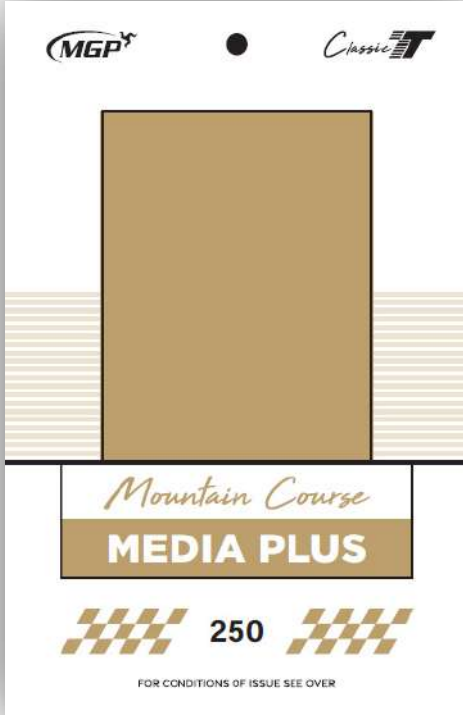

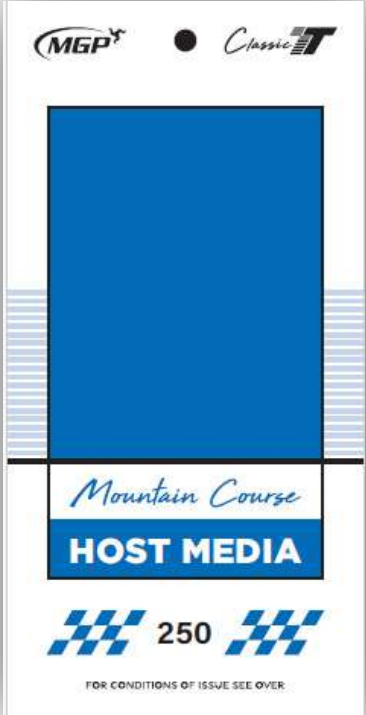

MEDIA PASSES

PASS TYPES & ALLOCATION

As part of the accreditation process, individuals who would receive Media, Media Plus, or Host Media passes must provide the following further documentation for the Press Office's reference:

- A copy of their Public Liability Insurance with a minimum coverage of £5,000,000;
- A written copy of a Risk Assessment from their organisation which identifies hazards, evaluates associated risks, and details reasonable control measures to mitigate hazards the applicant may encounter whilst operating in areas requiring pass access around the TT Mountain Course.

If their application is approved, individuals who would receive Media, Media Plus, or Host Media passes will be invited to complete an online test designed to assess their proficiency to operate in non-public areas around the TT Mountain Course. These individuals must successfully complete this test within the first two attempts to receive their media pass. *(Please note a completed test is valid for 12 months from the date of completion on the Accreditation Portal.)*

Media and Media Plus pass holders are required to wear an associated tabard when operating in any areas requiring pass access during all periods of road closure for racing activity.

PLEASE NOTE: The Press Office may, acting under the authority of the Race Organiser, withdraw any media pass at its discretion. Reasons for pass withdrawal include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Ignoring the instruction of event officials or marshals;
- Verbally or physically abusing event officials or marshals or using threatening behaviour;
- Entering an area not permitted with the level of assigned media pass without authorisation - see Media Pass Access;
- Bringing the event into disrepute.

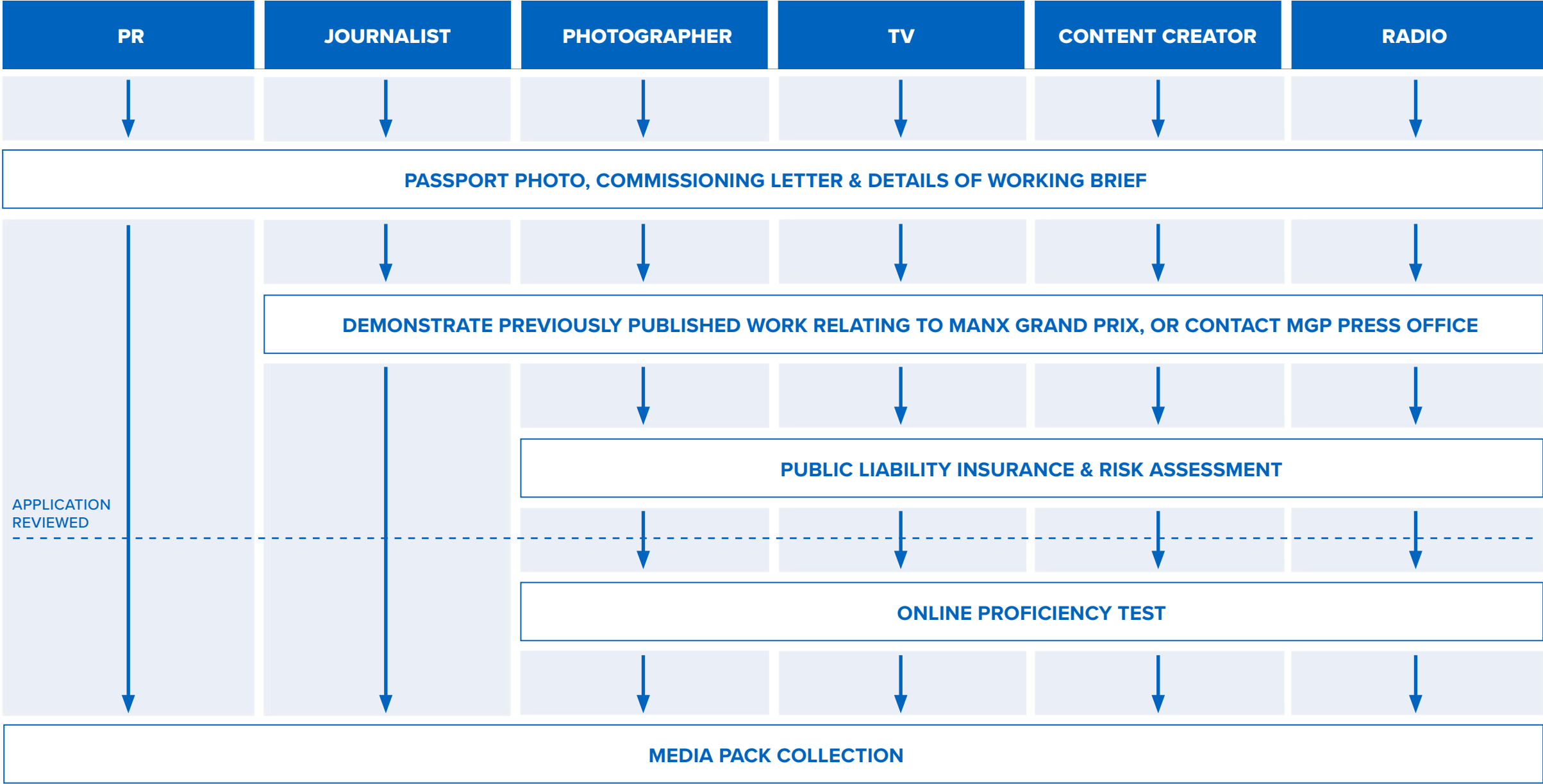

ACCREDITATION PROCESS



MEDIA GREEN ZONES

Media Green Zones were introduced by the Race Organiser for the 2024 Isle of Man TT Races and Manx Grand Prix. These are zones for use by accredited media personnel with the requisite pass and are within areas off limits to the public.

Each Media Green Zone has [specific boundaries, access points, and limits](#) on the number of media personnel that may operate from them at any one time.

In introducing these Media Green Zones, the Race Organiser - with support from the Race Promoter - has endeavoured to ensure that media personnel will be able to capture the content necessary to fulfil their working commissions and provide insightful coverage of the Classic TT and Manx Grand Prix, whilst operating to improved levels of risk management and mitigation.

The Race Organiser will review and evaluate Media Green Zones on a regular and ongoing basis.

For the 2025 Classic TT and Manx Grand Prix there are a total of 21 Media Green Zone locations around the TT Mountain Course. Details of which can be found in the [2025 Media Green Zone Information included as an appendix](#) to this document.



START LINE PASS

Access to the Start Line or the Assembly area for Media pass holders is available upon request, via the issue of an additional pass.

A [limited number](#) of Start Line passes are available per day and are issued by the Press Office upon request. Requests will be granted on a case-by-case basis and must be made by contacting the Press Office in advance and should specify the day or race requested.



MEDIA PEN

Journalist pass holders will have access to a Media Pen for post-race interviews with the top-three, podium finishers.

Media Pen details will be emailed out to Journalist pass holders on event.



MEDIA CENTRE

The Media Centre is found at the rear of the TT Grandstand and operated by the Press Office on behalf of the Classic TT and Manx Grand Prix.

WI-FI: Free internet access is available in the Media Centre.

SUSTAINABILITY: In order to reduce paper usage, qualifying and results will be available only through the official website and retrospective event's Live Timing Services:

- timing.iomttraces.com
- timing.manxgrandprix.co.uk

DESKS: Should you wish to reserve a work space, please speak to a member of the Manx Grand Prix Press Office upon your arrival.

LOCKERS: A small number of lockers are available within the Media Centre. Keys are available for a refundable deposit of £10 from a member of the Press Office.

PLEASE NOTE: All items left in the Media Centre are left at the owners' risk. Neither the Press Office nor the Department for Enterprise accept responsibility for loss, theft, or damage to property. CCTV is not in operation in the Media Centre.

MEDIA PACK

All accredited media will receive a Media Pack containing their pass, lanyard, and event programmes.

Media, Media Plus, and Host Media pass holders will also receive an associated tabard which must be worn when operating in any areas requiring pass access during all periods of road closure for racing activity. These tabards must be returned to the Press Office no later than Saturday 28th August. Failure to return a tabard by this deadline will result in any future accreditation application being refused.

Media Packs can be collected from the Media Centre. All members of accredited media must sign a Race Organiser waiver when collecting their Media Pack. The waiver confirms that the individual will act in accordance to instruction from the Race Organiser, event officials and marshals, that the individual acknowledges the risks inherent to motorsport, that they will undertake their duties with due and proper regard for their own safety, and that they acknowledge their participation in the event is entirely at their own risk.

PLEASE NOTE: Media Packs must be collected by the individual to whom the pass is issued. It is not possible to collect a Media Pack on behalf of anyone else.

INTERVIEW REQUESTS

The Press Office will endeavour to assist with any requests for interviews with competitors, team personnel, or event personnel.

In order to best fulfil your requirements, interview requests should be made before the start of the 2025 Classic TT or Manx Grand Prix wherever possible.

FILMING & VIDEOGRAPHY

As Commercial Rights Holders of the Classic TT and Isle of Man TT Races, the Isle of Man Government Department for Enterprise owns the rights to [any and all video content](#) captured in areas requiring pass or ticket access.

In addition, the Isle of Man Government Department for Enterprise owns the rights to [any and all footage](#) of, or relating to, the 2025 Classic TT captured by persons assigned or in possession of any pass or ticket valid for the 2025 event, irrespective of whether the footage is captured from within an area requiring pass or ticket to access or not.

Filming is [not permitted](#) in areas requiring pass or ticket access, or by any pass or ticket holder, [without express and written permission](#) from an authorised representative of the Isle of Man Government Department for Enterprise in the form of a License Agreement.

License Agreements are granted on a case-by-case basis, with proposals being evaluated as to whether they are in the strategic interests of the Manx Grand Prix.

Any and all footage captured in areas requiring pass or ticket access or by persons in possession of a pass or ticket is referred to as Licensed Footage, and its use is subject to a License Agreement.

License Agreements typically only allow for the use of footage captured and supplied by the Department or the Department's contracted partners. Only in exceptional circumstances will a third-party be permitted to capture its own Licensed Footage.

License Agreements are subject to a License Fee.

The Isle of Man Government Department for Enterprise [reserves the right to remove any content that contains Licensed Footage](#) from sale or publish if the requisite License Agreement is not in place, or if the content does not adhere to the terms of a License Agreement.

Any accredited media or media pass holder found to be capturing, publishing, or sharing Licensed Footage [without a License Agreement](#) or who is acting in [breach of the terms of a License Agreement](#) will have [their accreditation and pass revoked immediately](#), and

may not receive accreditation for any future events. This also extends to any individual using any other type of event pass who, in the view of the Department or Press Office, are acting in any media capacity.

The above terms in relation filming and videography are also applicable to the Manx Grand Prix, however the Manx Motor Cycle Club are the Commercial Rights Holders of the Manx Grand Prix and as such owns the rights to [any and all footage](#) of, or relating to, the 2025 Manx Grand Prix captured by persons assigned or in possession of any pass or ticket valid for the 2025 event.

As such, filming of the Manx Grand Prix is also [not permitted](#) in areas requiring pass or ticket access, or by any pass or ticket holder, [without express and written permission](#) from an authorised representative of the Press Office in the form of a License Agreement.

MEDIA REGULATIONS

Media accreditation at the 2025 Classic TT and Manx Grand Prix is for working professionals from the media industry only. By submitting a media accreditation application and, if approved, accepting any type of media pass, [accredited media personnel agree to the terms and regulations set out in this document](#). Failure to follow information in this document or instruction from the Press Office will result in the withdrawal of pass access and accreditation.

Accredited media must conduct and present themselves in a professional manner at all times, and must follow the instruction of event officials and marshals at all times.

The Race Organiser operates a strict, zero-tolerance policy on alcohol or illegal substances for individuals operating in areas requiring pass access during periods of road closure for racing activity, which extends to accredited media personnel. Testing procedures will be commensurate with any current legitimate procedure adopted and carried out in the UK. The permitted level of alcohol is 0.00g/L. Alcohol testing may be carried out on any accredited media personnel upon request of the Race Organiser by means of the standard breath test system by the Race Organiser's nominated Breath Alcohol Technicians.

A positive breath test or a refusal to undergo a test within the requested timeframe will result in the withdrawal of pass access and accreditation.

The Press Office has zero tolerance for aggressive or abusive behaviour.

INFORMATION FOR PHOTOGRAPHERS

When operating around the TT Mountain Course, photographers are reminded to respect home and land owners, and to gain consent before accessing or operating from any areas of private land.

The use of remotely operated cameras is not permitted without the permission of the Press Office on behalf of the Race Organiser.

When operating in areas requiring pass access such as Media Green Zones, photographers are not permitted to sit or lie down at any time. Photographers are permitted to kneel on one knee, but are strongly advised to remain standing on two feet at all times.

When operating in areas requiring pass access such as Media Green Zones, photographers are not permitted to use headphones or earphones at any time. Photographers are permitted to use ear protection, but this should not restrict the

individual's ability to hear and follow instruction from event officials or marshals.

During qualifying or race periods, photographers must stay behind or well clear of any Recticel barriers or other protective infrastructure.

Photographers must not stand in front of this infrastructure at any time and must not place any equipment or belongings on top of the infrastructure.

Photographers who capture images of any racing incidents or accidents must inform the Press Office and make their images available to the Race Organiser via the Press Office. These images must not be published or distributed further without the express permission of the Press Office. In the event of a racing incident, support and welfare is available via the Press Office.

If you notice any other accredited media personnel acting unsafely around the TT Course or in an area that requires pass access, you should notify your nearest marshal or event official, or report it to the Press Office.

APPENDIX I

MEDIA GREEN ZONES

Media Green Zones are being introduced by the Race Organiser from the 2024 Manx Grand Prix. These are zones for use by accredited media personnel with the requisite pass and are within areas off limits to the public.

Each Media Green Zone has [specific boundaries, access points, and limits](#) on the number of media personnel that may operate from them at any one time.

When operating in or seeking access to a Media Green Zone, the [instruction of race officials and marshals](#) must be followed at all times.

Media Green Zones may only be [accessed via the access points detailed in this appendix unless instructed otherwise](#) by an event official or marshal.

Media and Media Plus pass holders must not deviate from the location detailed in this appendix.

PLEASE NOTE: Entering areas of Closed Roads beyond a Media Green Zone or crossing the TT Course is not permitted without the express permission of a Travelling Marshal (if present) or a Chief Sector Marshal with approval from the Clerk of the Course.

Media Green Zone capacities operate on a [first-come first-served basis](#). In the event that you arrive to a Media Green Zone that is at capacity, you may be refused entry by an event official or marshal.

Failure to follow the information contained in this document or the instruction of an event official or marshal will result in the withdrawal of pass access and accreditation.

In case of any uncertainty with regards to the use of Media Green Zones, media personnel should contact the most senior marshal present.
